PREFACE

Over twenty years have elapsed since the publication of the first volume of the Catalogue of Babylonian Tablets in the British Museum which appeared under the hand of Dr H.H. Figulla in 1900, and with the appearance of the present volume, number VI in the series, a more regular pattern of publication will be instituted. The series of Catalogues will deal with the tablets in the sequence of their registration numbers, and are being prepared by a number of scholars under the overall coordinating editorship of Mr C.B.F. Walker, Assistant Keeper in the Department. The tablets were mostly excavated on behalf of the Trustees in the last century by Hormuzd Rassam, and Dr J.E. Reade, Senior Research Assistant in the Department, has supplied an introduction discussing what may be reconstructed about their provenances and associations.

The greater number of tablets in this and the following two volumes (VII-VIII) come from Abu Habbah, ancient Sippir, and the preparation of these three volumes has been in the hands of Dr E.V. Leichty, Professor of Assyriology in the University of Pennsylvania and Curator of Akkadian Language and Literature at the University Museum. He has been assisted in the preparation of the present volume by a number of colleagues, whose help he acknowledges in his Foreword, and his contribution has extended to the preparation of the printed text in Philadelphia, the camera-ready sheets having been brought to London for printing and binding.

Professor Leichty has earned the warmest thanks of specialists in the field, and the cooperation between the University Museum and the British Museum symbolised by this volume is a happy continuation of the former cooperation between the two museums over the excavations at Ur.
